DON'T MISS FRINGE BENEFITS IN PRAGUE

FANCY a trip to the Fringe... in Prague? Scottish songbird Andi Neate is taking her talents to the Czech Republic in May.

Andi, from Edinburgh, who has supported KT Tunstall on tour with her mix of story-telling and songs, is playing the Prague Fringe along with hundreds of top acts from all over the world.

That's nine days of theatre, music, dance and comedy running from May 28 to June 5. And most of the shows are in English.

The whole of Prague is turned into one big cabaret circuit with street acts throughout the fascinating old city.

The offer applies to bookings up to June 5, for travel from May 26 to June 8.

■ TRAIN operator East Coast have launched a new ticket offer between Scotland and London.

They're offering flexible First Class travel for less than the usual price of a Standard Class open ticket.

The new business ticket costs £199 — £54 cheaper than a Standard Class Anytime return rail fare from Edinburgh to London and £74 less than a normal First Class Anytime return fare.
